Job Purpose

The Licenced Practical Nurse (LPN) primarily provides foot care and assessments of clients of the North End Community Health Centre and the Mobile Outreach Street Health (MOSH). Reporting to the **Managers of Primary Care & MOSH**, the LPN is a part of a collaborative team of health-care professionals that support individuals and communities in managing their own health. The Nurse will work closely with physicians, nurse practitioners, mental health clinicians, social workers dietitians, and support staff to support the organizations mission, vision and values. This role may require outreach services with partner sites and organizations.

Position Responsibilities

Foot Care Assessments & Procedures:

- Assess the foot care needs of clients.
- Accept and triage of referrals for foot care
- Provide appropriate care based on assessment.
- Provide teaching and education as indicated.
- Document all care/services provided according to Centre protocols and the National Competencies for Advanced Nursing Foot Care.
- Provide follow-up care including referral to primary providers or specialists as required.
- Work collaboratively with all members the health team, the client, other team members of the NECHC, MOSH, and any appropriate care provider.

Education and Experience

- Graduate of an accredited school of Licenced Practical Nursing
- Licenced Practical Nurse registered in the Province of Nova Scotia
- CPR certification, Nonviolent crises intervention or willingness to be trained upon employment
- Recent clinical and community experience and knowledge of current community challenges and opportunities relating to the mission of the organization is considered an asset
- Foot Care certification required

Professional Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- Knowledge and experience with the founding communities (African Nova Scotian and First Nation) as well as Newcomer/Immigrant, 2SLGBTGDQQIA++ and the homeless communities of Halifax considered an asset
- Knowledge and understanding of the social determinants of health and harm reduction philosophy
- Values diversity with a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion
- Ability to work with a degree of autonomy, demonstrate critical thinking and sound judgement
- A commitment to ongoing learning and development

Commitment to Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

NECHC is intentional in creating spaces that are inclusive and intentionally reflect our communities.
