PAUSE Mental Health Clinic

The Pause Mental Health Walk-In Program delivers mental health services using a single session, walk-in model both in person and over the phone. Operating three nights a week in different locations, Pause provides support for community members experiencing issues around mental health and mental wellness symptom management, grief, trauma, and other issues.

Job Purpose

The Mental Health Clinician will deliver mental health support to community members in a walk-in, single session program both in person and over the phone, as part of a multidisciplinary team. The Mental Health Clinician will be responsible for seeing community members in single sessions as well as participating in team building and clinical supervision activities with the Mental Health Walk-In Program team. The Mental Health Clinician will be responsible for keeping up to date case notes, making referrals and taking part in evaluations.

Key Responsibilities

- Providing clinical mental health care on a one on one basis to community members who may be experiencing homelessness, poverty, and other effects of systemic marginalization
- Working collaboratively with other agencies
- Making appropriate referrals
- Keeping up to date case notes
- Working with other collaborative health team members to help support client care plans
- Other duties as assigned

Education and Experience

- Masters in Counselling, Social Work or BSc – Nursing (with appropriate training in Mental Health Counselling or Therapy)
- Registration with appropriate governing body
- Minimum two years experience in community mental health settings
- Demonstrated understanding of anti-oppressive work and trauma informed care
- Experience advocating in large systems, such as income assistance or housing is an asset
- Ability to maintain a high degree of discretion, diplomacy, and confidentiality

Professional Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- Experience and a high degree of knowledge of clinical mental health skills. Including an understanding of different modalities including, but not limited to, trauma based, feminist, strength based, solutions focused, acceptance and commitment, cognitive, behavioural and narrative therapies
- Knowledge of harm reduction
- Demonstrated risk assessment skills

- Knowledge and experience with the founding communities (African Nova Scotian and First Nation) as well as Newcomer/Immigrant communities, and the LGBTQA+ communities of Halifax
- Knowledge of current community challenges and opportunities relating to mental health and wellness
- Must be able to work with a degree of autonomy and demonstrate critical thinking and sound clinical judgement
- Highly motivated, proactive and creative with the ability to be adaptive and resilient
- Values diversity with a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion
- A commitment to ongoing learning and development
